## SECTION 4: First aid measures

### 4.1. Description of first aid measures

### 5.1. Extinguishing media

Fire hazard : Combustible liquid. Irritating fumes of hydrochloric acid and organic acid vapors may develop when material is exposed to water or open flame.

### 7.1. Precautions for safe handling
